

**Morval Parish Council  
Forward Planning**

The purpose of this document is to enable the public to be aware of priorities identified by the parish council and of the steps it is taking to achieve the goals listed.

The first two tables give details of priorities which the council identified for the Community Network Area and matters that have been brought to the council's attention on at least one but usually on more occasions whilst the final table gives details of priorities that have been brought to a conclusion since 2014.

**The following were identified as priorities for the Parish following a request from the Community Network Support Officer.**

<b>Goal</b>	<b>Priority</b>	<b>Action Taken</b>
Reduce the speed limit along the main road through Morval	<b>High</b>	11th January, 2017 - Cornwall Councillor Candy informed the council that this matter remains ongoing.
Poor broadband and mobile telephone service	<b>High</b>	11 <sup>th</sup> January, 2017 – Sandplace still without broadband – clerk investigating.
Provision of traffic calming measures within Widegates Village	<b>High</b>	Cornwall Councillor Candy informed the meeting that available funding had gone to Bodmin. 5 <sup>th</sup> October, 2016.
Provision of local affordable housing	<b>High</b>	January 2017 – public consultation event held re: potential housing scheme in Widegates.
Provision of play areas for the parish	<b>High</b>	Update received – group to work independently of the council 07-12-16.

Grit Bins	Some sites identified not in accord with Cornwall Council's policy so Councillor Chudleigh to identify new appropriate locations.	<b>Medium</b>	Councillor Chudleigh informed the meeting held on the 4 <sup>th</sup> May, 2016 that this matter remains ongoing.
Bench for Shortacross end of main road through Widegates	Awaiting redevelopment of junction at Shortacross. Cormac has stated that funding for this work has not been granted.	<b>Low</b>	Gateway Features funding bid made by Cormac unsuccessful but being submitted again in 2018 for work to be carried out in 2019.
Speed reductions around the parish	Advice received that following a public consultation, a Road Traffic Order could be applied for.	<b>High</b>	Cornwall Councillor Jim Candy reported to the meeting held on the 4 <sup>th</sup> May, 2016 that funding has been applied for.
Request received from resident for some sort of safe crossing at the Liskeard end of Widegates Village.	Was this included as part of the traffic calming scheme at the Shortacross end of the village? Cormac to be asked if it can be helpful with this matter.	<b>Medium</b>	Response from Cormac: Gateway Features funding bid (including safety measures) unsuccessful. Bid to be rolled forward and resubmitted in 2018 for 2019 works.
Safe play area for children.	Update received – group to work independently of the council 07-12-16.	<b>High</b>	January, 2017 – public consultation events held and first committee meeting held for children and adults.

Street lighting along main road through Widegates at Shortacross end.	05-10-2016 - Response received from Hastoe and discussed by council – all outstanding work to be carried out by Cormac – confirmed by Councillor Candy. As no date was given for work to commence, clerk to write again to request representative from Hastoe to attend one of its meetings.	<b>Medium</b>	December '16 – update from Hastoe – Cormac requested to carry out all outstanding work – commencement date to be supplied once Cormac has informed Hastoe.
Bus shelters for Nomansland.	Bus shelter being erected during January 2017. Pole and flag should be erected during December 2016.	<b>High</b>	Pole erected and new safer location being used by the public. Shelter to be erected between the 13 <sup>th</sup> and 15 <sup>th</sup> February 2017.
Fencing and hand rail at the rear of the “Village Green” to reduce the potential for slips, trips and falls.	December 2016 – Funding secured, Councillor Hutchins to seek out appropriately skilled volunteers to carry out the work.	<b>High</b>	January, 2017 – Councillor Hutchins clarified that the fencing is a private project that he is carrying out unrelated to the Council.

2014	To transfer ownership of the council owned lane running adjacent to Trenode School land.	Transfer of lane to Trenode School completed.
2015	To complete an asset transfer process of the land known as “The Village Green”, Widegates so that it remains a valued community asset for 100 years.	Cornwall Council unable to complete formal asset transfer but letter agreement now in place giving authority to the Parish Council to be responsible for the gardening maintenance of the land.
2015	Morval War Memorial	Cleaned
2015	To remove the Leyland notice board and donate it to St. Wenna’s Church. Relocate the old Sandplace board to a new position at Leyland	Work completed November 2015 and removed board donated to the Church.
2016	To replace the Widegates notice board which is deteriorating and in need of repair. To safely ensure that the Reading Room Committee’s electricity supply is safely dealt with as part of this goal.	Parish Council facilitated a small wall being erected at Widegates “Village Green” to house the Reading Room’s electricity supply.
2016	To reduce the hazards identified as part of the risk assessment process at the “Village Green”.	Steps repaired by BT and rear path now part of its regular maintenance programme.
