11. Bridlepaths that link Colvase Farm to Widlake Woods, and Widlake Woods to Widegates

To consider a request from Miranda Smith to have the two bridlepaths re-instated. She has been told that the Widegates bridlepath is no longer safe for horses. You can access Widlake Woods from Widegates village centre (Widlake Lane) but the track has been eroded by rainwater and is very steep and rocky in places, especially towards the bottom end. It's also favoured by Moto-X bikes at weekends. The Colvase bridleway is now inaccessible. There are fallen trees and it's very steep and grown in.

Miranda, who has also contacted Cornwall Council, writes: 'Could we please get these restored as we are in desperate need of safe, off road hacking in the area – especially during these busy summer months'

12. Looe Development Trust footpaths initiative

Cornwall Council has asked for the council's comments on an application from Mrs Luminta Buibas (trading as 'B Alive') to trade in a lay-by on the B3252 close to Polgover Farm, PL13 1PY. *Details already e-mailed to councillors*

14. New speed limit sign location, A387 western end of Widegates village

The speed limit sign has already been re-located. However, to follow legal requirements, a formal consultation still has to take place. (A previous consultation was conducted by Cornwall Council back in 2019 but, because of issues with the developer not completing the works in the set time, the two-year period ran out and, therefore, a new consultation is required)

15. Speed limits on Sandplace Road

He suggests: 'Morval Parish Council believes that the way Cornwall is governed is extremely important to our local residents. We note the emerging proposals for a possible change to a powerful Mayor of Cornwall with their own staff, budget and choice of Cabinet. We believe that such a system should only be implemented if the people of Cornwall support it. We call on Cornwall Council and our local Cornwall Councillors to ensure that there is a referendum of all voters in Cornwall on whether to introduce this significant change, as set out in the relevant legislation'

St Keyne/Trewidland and Menheniot parish councils would like Morval PC to join them in a joint approach to Cornwall Highways about traffic management issues on the road around Horningtops following the recent accident
