### **The National Child Measurement**

### **Programme (NCMP) has started**


Trained members of the school nursing team will soon be measuring the height and weight of children in Reception and Year 6, as part of the government programme.

The NCMP aims to measure the height and weight of every child twice during primary school, once in Reception and once in Year 6. If you have a child in these years, you'll receive a digital booklet through your child's school, before your child is measured, with more information.

Your child doesn't have to take part, but every child measured contributes to building a national picture about how children are growing. This information is used to inform the planning and delivery of services that help children and families to lead healthy lives.

Parents will be notified at least 2 weeks before measurements are scheduled to place in their school.

# Flu Season is back!

Flu season is here again and Kernow Health CIC, who run school age immunisations, have started their nasal flu vaccination programme.

There have been some changes this year and vaccinations are now offered to children from reception through to year 11. Some parents and guardians have already received a letter from the Kernow Health CIC, sent on their behalf by schools, with a link to an online consent form.

If you haven't had a letter yet, one will be heading your way over the coming weeks. This is an opt-in process which means your child will only receive the vaccine if you consent.

Don't worry if your child is absent on the day of the vaccinations, you can book an appointment at one of Kernow Health's community catch-up clinics during the October half term and again in December for those who missed out at school, or for children who are home-educated.

If you have any questions about this vaccination, or if you have problems accessing the online consent form, please **call Kernow Health on 01872 221105**, and they can complete it with you over the phone. Please also call to book your child onto a catch-up clinic.

Pensioners in receipt of pension credit will automatically receive £80. You do not need to apply for this. Families with children eligible for benefits-related free school meals will also receive a payment of £80 per child. This will be made available through your child's school - you do not need to apply.

#### **News in brief**

If you are on a low income, or pay for more than 3 prescription items in 3 months, or 11 items in 12 months, you could save money on your prescriptions. A Prescription Prepayment Certificate covers all NHS prescriptions for a set pre-paid price, or spread over 10 direct debit payments. People on a low income could be entitled to help with costs or free prescriptions through the low income scheme, depending on your circumstances.
