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There will be some changes to recycling, rubbish and garden waste collections over the Christmas period.

Recycling and garden waste collections

If your recycling (or garden waste collection if you're a garden waste service subscriber) is due on **Monday 25 December**, it will be collected on **Saturday 23 December**.

If your recycling (or garden waste collection if you're a garden waste service subscriber) is due on **Tuesday 26 December**, it will be collected on **Saturday 30 December**.

Rubbish collections

If your rubbish collection is due on **Monday 25 December**, it will be collected on **Monday 1 January**.

If your rubbish collection is due on **Tuesday 26 December**, it will be collected on **Tuesday 2 January**.

All other collections will take place as normal.

During more planned strikes involving junior doctors, health and care services across Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly are still very busy.


We want to help you choose the right service so our NHS can focus on the people who most need emergency care.

Please remember over the Christmas period:

- GPs are open outside bank holidays for any ongoing symptoms, check with your GP Surgery for opening hours
- Minor Injury Units and Urgent Treatment Centres your nearest MIU might not be the quickest option. Check opening hours and live wait times <u>online</u>
- Visit your local Pharmacist who can also provide an emergency prescription when your GP is closed, even if you are on holiday. <u>Check</u> <u>your nearest open pharmacy</u>. Many urgent medications can now be ordered online for collection at a local pharmacy, by visiting <u>NHS 111</u> <u>online</u>
- If you need urgent care advice, visit <u>NHS 111 online</u> or call 111. Expert clinicians can direct you to the best service for your needs
- If you are worried about your own or someone else's mental health, Cornwall's 24/7 mental health helpline can help. Call free on 0800 038 5300. For more mental health support services, visit the <u>NHS Cornwall</u> and Isles of Scilly website

The NHS 'Find a pharmacy' search tool can help you find the nearest pharmacy to you that's open over Christmas and New Year (tip: click on the pharmacy name to view its bank holiday opening hours).

Pharmacists are highly trained so can help with a long list of minor ailments, including eye and skin conditions. They can be a great first port of call for advice, from self-care home remedies to treatment for complex concerns. You can even have a consultation in a private room.

Remember to take repeat medicines with you if you're staying away from home. If you do run out for any reason, the local pharmacist can often help with an emergency supply.



Domestic abuse happens every day of the year, and sadly this includes Christmas

If you are experiencing abuse yourself or are concerned about someone you know, reach out and ask for help if you can.

Could you be a shared lives carer this Christmas?

Cornwall Council works with Shared Lives South West to help people into shared living arrangements or short break respite.

The arrangement can support people with learning disabilities, people living with autism, mental ill health, dementia, and older people, to live as independently as possible.

The person with care and support needs lives in a shared lives carer's home, either permanently or for a short period of time. Find out more.

Cornwall Council's adoption service, which also covers the Isles of Scilly, is to join the Regional Adoption Agency, Adopt South West, from April 2024. Cornwall, including the Isles of Scilly, will be joining the region already covered by Adopt South West, which includes the local authority areas of, Devon, Plymouth, Torbay and Somerset. <u>Read more</u>.
