Storm Bert yellow weather warnings

A yellow weather warning is in place for rain across Cornwall from 6am Saturday until 11.45 on Sunday evening, and another yellow warning for wind is valid from 3pm on Saturday until 9pm Sunday evening.

We're also still under a yellow cold weather alert until 23 November at 6pm.


Please keep up to date with the weather forecast over the weekend as these alerts could change.

As we're expecting gale forces winds do not go out unless you really have to, and if you are driving, make sure you drive to the conditions, and not to the speed limit. Plan your route, listen out for travel updates and make sure you have essentials with you in the car - warm clothing, food, drink, blanket, torch etc.

If you spot a safety issue on the highway, please report it to our 24 hour service on 0300 1234 222 and give details of the issue and the location. With high winds forecast, please stay away from the edge of the sea as conditions can be unpredictable and extremely dangerous.

Ahead of the storm, try to secure loose objects such as garden furniture or trampolines, to avoid them from being blown around and potentially causing damage.


16 Days of Action to end violence against women and girls

Changes to sofas and armchairs being accepted at HWRCs

Some of Cornwall's Household Waste and Recycling Centres (HWRCs) can no longer accept sofas, armchairs and other upholstered furniture, due to new regulations imposed by the Environment Agency.

From 1 December, all upholstered furniture must be stored and transported separately from other non-recyclable waste. This applies to all seating that contains leather, synthetic leather, other fabric, or foam. Examples include sofas, sofa beds, armchairs, recliner chairs (electrical or mechanical), dining chairs, padded stools and foot stools, office chairs, futons, bean bags, floor and sofa cushions.

Due to a lack of space at some of Cornwall's HWRCs, the following sites will **not** be able to accept these items;

Overnight closures at Chiverton Junction in December

From Monday 2 December at 9am, National Highways will be implementing overnight closures of the Chiverton gyratory for 3 weeks (weeknights only until 20 December) for finishing work on the verges, traffic islands, footpaths and supporting walls.

This will include overnight closures of the slip roads and operate from 8pm until 6am, except on Wednesdays when closures will start at 10pm to allow for Truro late night Christmas shopping.

Through traffic on the dual carriageway will not be affected. Diversion routes will be in place for access to and from Truro and other locations.

There'll be another 9 nights of these overnight closures of the Chiverton gyratory after Christmas, weeknights from 14-17 and 20-24 January.
