Planning a farmyard visit this summer?

Meeting the animals at a farmyard visit or event can be delightful and educational, especially for children, but remember they carry germs that can cause diarrhoea, vomiting, and fever.

You can make sure your farmyard visit is both fun and safe by following these hygiene tips from the [UK Health Security Agency](#):

- **always wash your hands** thoroughly with soap and warm water after touching animals, fences, or any surfaces where animals have been
- remember, **hand gels or wipes are not as effective** as proper hand washing
- **don't eat and drink** around the animals - save snacks for designated picnic areas
- **keep an eye on little ones** to ensure they follow these hygiene practices too
- **wearing closed-toe shoes** is a good idea, and
- remember to **clean your footwear and pushchair wheels** before heading home

Help shape the future of Cornwall's sexual health services


Our Public Health team is working on a new 10-year strategy to improve sexual and reproductive health services across Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly—and we want your input.



- A30 closed Eastbound and Westbound between Scorrier Junction and Carland Cross
